TURKEY NAPKIN RING OR NAME PLACEHOLDER

SUPPLIES

- Empty Paper Towel roll
- 1-1/2 in. x 6 in. Light Brown Cardstock
- 2 qty. of 2 in. Circles - Light Brown Cardstock
- 2 qty. of 1 in. x 3 in. - Orange Cardstock
- 2 qty. of 1 in. x 3 in. - Yellow Cardstock
- 1 qty. of 1 in. x 3 in. - Red Cardstock
- 1 in. x 1 in. Orange Cardstock (for beak)
- 1 in. x 1 in. Red Cardstock (for waddle)
- 1/4 in. Double Stick Tape or Tacky Glue
- 2 qty. 10 mm. Moving Eyes

TOOLS

- Ruler and Pencil
- Scissors
- 2 in. Circle Paper Punch - Optional

INSTRUCTIONS

NOTE: You do not have to use a paper towel roll, but it does make the turkey sturdier.



1. Use the ruler to measure 1-1/2 in. from one end of the tube. Mark several places around the tube. Flatten the tube and draw a line.



2. Cut straight across on the line to get a short piece of the tube. Unflatten the short 1-1/2 in. tube.



3. Use glue or double stick tape around the edges and wrap the 1-1/2 in. x 6 in. strip of light brown cardstock around the outside of the tube. The ends overlap about 1/2 in.



4. Use a 2 in. Paper Punch or the pattern provided to trace and cut out 2 circles from light brown cardstock. Take one circle and cut in half for the wings, set on the side.



5. Take the remaining circle for the head and glue on the two eyes. Cut out a tiny triangle from the orange cardstock for a beak and glue below the eyes. Next, cut out an "s" from red cardstock for the turkey's waddle and glue onto the bottom right side of the beak.



6. Glue the head onto the front of the ring about half way up. Glue a wing on either side of the body.



7. Take each strip of orange, yellow and red cardstocks and curve cut into "feathers".



8. Arrange the feathers into a fan shape with the red in the middle, orange on each side and then lastly the yellow at the outer edges.



9. Glue the fan, to the outside back of the tube about 1/4 in. down for the tail.



10. Roll up your napkin and place inside of the tube for a napkin ring.



11. For a name card holder, cut a slit on either side of the tube about 1/2 in. down. Cut a 2 in. x 3 in. cardstock and write a name on top. Place the card inside of the slits to hold
