



SOAP BUBBLE PAINTING

SUPPLIES & TOOLS

- Paints - Tempera, Acrylic, or Watercolor in assorted colors
- Dishwashing Liquid - Dawn
- Water
- Small Bowls - one for each color
- Measuring Spoons #6299960
- Measuring Cups #6299895
- Spoon for mixing
- Drinking Straws
- Paper for Painting - Mixed Media #30132057
- Table covering - plastic tablecloth or old newspaper

NOTE: Have all your supplies, including the paper, ready before you start mixing. Cover the work surface with a table covering because it can get a little messy. The paints used in the sample are Delta Ceramcoat Acrylic Paint Velvet Teal #30201094, Passion Purple #30084944, and Gecko Green #30084954.



INSTRUCTIONS



1. In the small bowl, combine 2 tablespoons of paint, 2 tablespoons of dishwashing liquid, and 1/4 cup of water. Mix well.



2. Place a straw in the paint/soap mixture. Blow into the mixture to create bubbles. Let the bubbles rise to the top of the bowl.

CAUTION: Be Careful to NOT suck up any of the liquid through the straw.

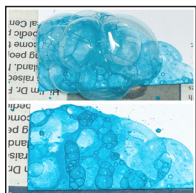


3. Getting the bubbles onto the paper - 1 technique

With the bubbles in the bowl, you can touch the paper to the bubbles.

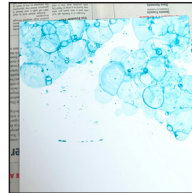


4. Another technique - You can scoop some of the bubbles from the bowl and place onto the paper.

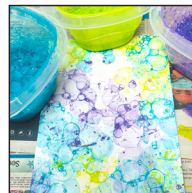


5. Let the bubbles pop naturally on the paper. Or, you can lightly blow on the bubbles to get them to pop.

When the bubbles pop, they will leave the paint on the paper, creating a design.



6. Add more bubbles onto different parts of the paper to create your design.



7. Continue this process and add other colors of paint bubbles. You can layer different colors on top of each other.

Let the paper dry.



8. Once dry, use the soap bubble backgrounds for a paper project.

You can cut them to size and use for greeting card backgrounds.

Cut and fold into small gift/treat boxes.

The possibilities are endless!
