

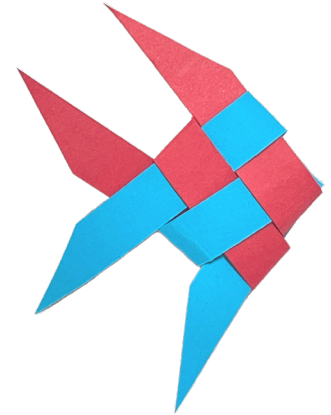
WOVEN PAPER FISH

SUPPLIES & TOOLS

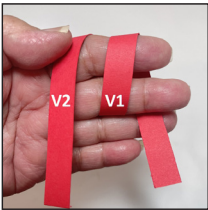
- 2 qty. 1/2-in. x 11-in. Cardstock – one or two colors
- Scissors

Optional –

- 2 qty. Moving eyes
- Tacky Glue, mini glue dots or low temp glue gun



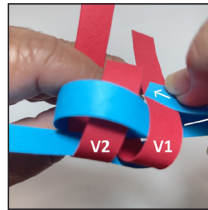
INSTRUCTIONS



1. Take one strip of cardstock and wrap around your index and middle fingers of your left hand as shown.

It will sort of resemble the letter “m” around your fingers.

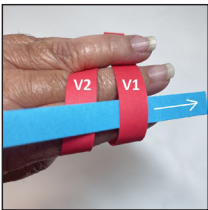
The vertical wraps are labeled V1 and V2 in the photo.



6. Turn your hand over with the palm slightly facing down.

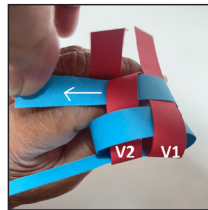
Tip – You can slightly pull your fingers out at this point.

Take the other loose end of strip #2 and bring it around your fingertips and to the top of your hand. Wrap over V1.

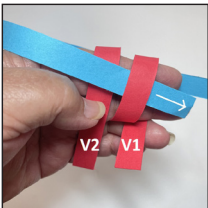


2. Turn your hand over with the palm facing down.

Take cardstock strip #2 and going in the direction away from your wrist, slide one end under V1 the vertical wrap that is closest to your fingertip.



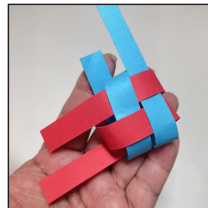
7. Slide the end of the strip under V2. Pull the end out. This will be part of the tail.



3. Turn your hand back around so your palm is facing you.

Take the other end of strip #2 and going in the direction away from your wrist, slide under V1 the vertical strip closest to your fingertip.

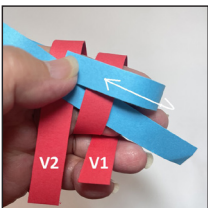
Both ends of strip #2 should be sticking out by your fingertips.



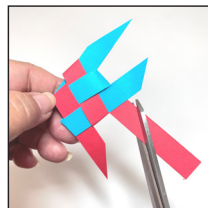
8. Slide your fingers out.

Carefully, tighten up the weave to form the fish.

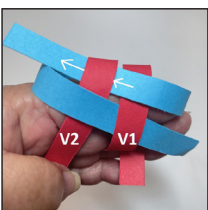
You can flatten the weave or leave it slightly puffy depending on how dimensional you want your fish to be.



4. Bring the first end of strip #2 around your fingertips to the palm side and over the V1.



9. Trim the ends of the strip to make the fins and tail.



5. Slide strip #2 under V2 the vertical strip #1 closest to your wrist.

Pull the end out, angling upwards. This will be the top fin.
